The appointee will be responsible for the initial development of the Centre encompassing inter alia:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The framing of the strategy and objectives of the Centre within the context of the LUMS Purpose and the University's ambition for the Health Innovation Campus • The positioning of the Centre as a leading source of accessible interdisciplinary expertise around the challenges facing health care policy makers and managers • The development of relationships with colleagues involved in health sector research, most notably in the Faculty of Health and Medicine, including working with the University's Health Engagement and Innovation Team • The development of the research agenda for the Centre in collaboration with academic colleagues and key external stakeholders with particular emphasis on funding and impact • The development, in collaboration with colleagues responsible for postgraduate and executive programmes, of a portfolio of programmes underpinned by the Centre's research. <p>Beyond the leadership of the Centre, the appointee will be expected to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop high quality, globally significant publications addressing both practitioner and academic audiences on contemporary healthcare challenges • Attract external research income, from both public and private sources, to conduct research on key contemporary healthcare challenges • Forge close connections with healthcare professionals, managers and policy makers to support the development of solutions to contemporary healthcare challenges • Contribute to the development of teaching content for postgraduate and executive programmes on issues around contemporary healthcare • Undertake other appropriate academic duties as required by the relevant Head of Department and Dean of LUMS • Participate in major committees within LUMS and the University as appropriate and be willing to take on leadership and management roles appropriate to seniority
